










My Best Christmas

Class 2 have been having some fun!




Last half term some of




SPORTS ARE AMAZING!!!!!!!!!!

A lot of people really like them because they say they're fun. This is what Matthew, a pupil in Class 5, had to say; "I have been to these clubs and I loved them."



Hopefully we can get lots more new books for the school children to have fun and read.


