Tough Tortoises

As part of our curriculum, we emphasise the development of key skills useful in learning and in later life. These are known as building learning power skills (BLP) and centre around four characters – Tough Tortoise; Resourceful Rabbit; Pondering Panda; Co-operative Chameleon.

This half term, we are focussing on Tough Tortoise – being determined; persevering even when we find things hard; ignoring distractions. In Friday's assembly, we awarded certificates to children who had displayed these qualities during the week.

We love reading!

Developing children as life-long readers is a key aim of the school. The school expectation is that children read at least 3 times a week at home (more if possible!). A raffle ticket is given to each child who reads 3 times (2 raffle tickets are gained if they read every day Monday – Friday) – this needs to be recorded in the child's reading record. In Friday's assembly, we pull a lucky winner out of each class's raffle pot and they win a prize. Last week, every child in Class 5 achieved the expectation of reading at least 3 times a week. Well done Year 6 – a fantastic start and a great example to the whole school. Keep it up!
