

Millhouse Primary School Uniform Policy

1. Aims

This policy aims to:

- Set out our approach to requiring a uniform that is of reasonable cost and offers the best value for money for parents and carers, having taken full account of the Education Act 2021 (Guidance about Cost of School Uniform)
- Explain how we will avoid discrimination in line with our legal duties under the Equality Act 2010
- Clarify our expectations for school uniform

2. Our school's legal duties under the Equality Act 2010

The Equality Act 2010 prohibits discrimination against an individual based on the protected characteristics, which include sex, race, religion or belief, and gender reassignment.

To avoid discrimination, our school will:

- Avoid listing uniform items based on sex, to give all pupils the opportunity to wear the uniform they feel most comfortable in or that most reflects their self-identified gender
- Make sure that our uniform costs the same for all pupils
- Allow all pupils to have long hair (though we reserve the right to ask for this to be tied back)
- Allow all pupils to style their hair in the way that is appropriate for school yet makes them feel most comfortable
- Allow pupils to request changes to swimwear for religious reasons
- Allow pupils to wear headscarves and other religious or cultural symbols
- Allow for adaptations to our policy on the grounds of equality by asking pupils or their parents to get in touch with the Headteacher who can answer questions about the policy and respond to any requests

3. Limiting the cost of school uniform

Our school has a duty to make sure that the uniform we require is affordable, in line with statutory guidance from the Department for Education on the cost of school uniform.

We understand that items with distinctive characteristics (such as branded items, or items that have to have a school logo or a unique

fabric/colour/design) cannot be purchased from a wide range of retailers and that requiring many such items limits parents' ability to 'shop around' for a low price.

We will make sure our uniform:

- Is available at a reasonable cost
- Provides the best value for money for parents/ carers

We will do this by:

- Carefully considering whether any items with distinctive characteristics are necessary
- Limiting any items with distinctive characteristics where possible featuring the school logo
- Limiting items with distinctive characteristics to low-cost or long-lasting items, such as ties
- Avoiding specific requirements for items pupils could wear on nonschool days, such as coats, bags and shoes
- Keeping the number of optional branded items to a minimum, so that the school's uniform can act as a social leveller
- Avoiding different uniform requirements for different year/class/house groups
- Avoiding different uniform requirements for extra-curricular activities
- Considering alternative methods for signalling differences in groups for interschool competitions, such as creating posters or labels
- Making sure that arrangements are in place for parents to acquire second-hand uniform items
- Avoiding frequent changes to uniform specifications and minimising the financial impact on parents of any changes
- Consulting with parents and pupils on any proposed significant changes to the uniform policy and carefully considering any complaints about the policy
- 4. Expectations for school uniform
- 4.1 Our school's uniform

Boys

Black or grey trousers

Black or grey shorts (not sports shorts)

White shirt (long or short sleeve)

White or red polo shirt

Red jumper (v-neck, sweat or hoodie)

Grey, black or white socks

Black shoes (trainer style school shoes are also acceptable)

Girls



Black or grey trousers

Black or grey skirt

Black or grey shorts or culottes

Black or grey pinafore dress

White shirt/blouse (long or short sleeve)

Red and white gingham dress

White or red polo shirt

Red jumper (v-neck, sweat or hoodie)

Red cardigan

White, black or grey socks

Black or grey tights (plain tights only)

Black shoes (trainer style school shoes are also acceptable)

P.E. Kit

Black shorts

White t-shirt (no football shirts)

Black tracksuit bottoms

Black tracksuit top

Trainers

In terms of jewellery, pupils can wear one pair of stud earrings and a watch. For health & safety purposes all jewellery must be removable for PE.

4.2 Where to purchase uniform

Logo school uniform items from our uniform supplier, Vortex, are available to order online or via the school office. Orders are collected each Thursday and returned to school by the following Thursday (outside of the peak summer ordering period).

It is not necessary to wear items with logos - non-logo uniform can be purchased from supermarkets and many high street stores.

All children will have a school book bag and P.E. bag provided when they start school. Replacements can be purchased throughout the year from the school office.

A second-hand uniform sale is held monthly by the FOMS group at the front of school.

5. Expectations for our school community

5.1 Pupils

Pupils are expected to wear the correct uniform at all times (other than specified non-school uniform days) while:

- On the school premises

- Travelling to and from school
- At out-of-school events or on trips that are organised by the school, or where they are representing the school (if required)

Pupils are also expected to contact Karen Gray, headteacher, if they want to request an amendment to the uniform policy in relation to their protected characteristics.

5.2 Parents and carers

Parents and carers are expected to make sure their child has the correct uniform and PE kit, and that every item is:

- Clean
- Clearly labelled with the child's name
- In good condition

Parents are also expected to contact Karen Gray, headteacher if they want to request an amendment to the uniform policy in relation to:

- Their child's protected characteristics
- The cost of the uniform

Parents are expected to lodge any complaints or objections relating to the school uniform in a timely and reasonable manner.

Disputes about the cost of the school uniform will be:

- Resolved locally
- Dealt with in accordance with our school's complaints policy
- The school will work closely with parents to arrive at a mutually acceptable outcome.

5.3 Staff

Staff will closely monitor pupils to make sure they are in the correct uniform. They will give any pupils and families breaching the uniform policy the opportunity to comply but will follow up with the Headteacher if the situation doesn't improve.

Ongoing breaches of our uniform policy will be addressed by the headteacher with parents.

In cases where it is suspected that financial hardship has resulted in a pupil not complying with this uniform policy, staff will take a mindful and considerate approach to resolving the situation.

5.4 Governors

The Governing Body will review this policy and make sure that it:

- Is appropriate for our school's context
- Is implemented fairly across the school
- Takes into account the views of parents and pupils

- Offers a uniform that is appropriate, affordable, practical and safe for all pupils

6. Monitoring arrangements

The school shall be responsible for reviewing this policy from time to time, ensuring that it meets legal requirements and reflects best practice.
