Write sentences using capital letters, full stops, question marks and exclamation marks Use conjunctions to join ideas (and, but, so, because)

Use suffixes where no change of the root word is needed (s, es, ed, ing, er)

Reread sentences to check my own work.

Grandad's Island: We will write setting descriptions and write our own narrative based on the story. Use the un prefix to spell new words (unhappy, unclear)

Write different types of sentences (statements, commands and guestions)

<u>After half term</u> we will read **Little Red** and work on writing exciting sentences that are linked.

We will work on our character descriptions to find the baddie!

Umbrella: We will develop our story writing skills putting into practice all the skills we have learned so far.

Reading:

Recognise and read Year 1 common exception words.

Read words with two or syllables accurately including those with suffixes.

Answer guestions and make inferences on the basis of what was said.

Explain what has happened in stories we have read.

Name the letters of the alphabet

Read out my work loud enough for others to hear

Physical Education:

Net and wall games and Sending and Receiving

Religious education: Judaism- Is Shabbat important to Jewish children?

PSHE- Jigsaw – Relationships/ Changes

Science:

Plants

Identify and name a variety of common wild and garden plants, including deciduous and evergreen trees Identify and describe the basic structure of a variety of common flowering plants, including trees.

Observe and describe how seeds and bulbs grow into mature plants

Find out and describe how plants need water, light and a suitable temperature to grow and stay healthy.

To observe closely, using simple equipment in the context of observing the growth of plants.

We will also learn about seasonal changes from Spring to Summer.

Read and write numbers to 100 in numerals; count in multiples of twos, fives and tens given a number, identify one more and one less use the language of: equal to, more than, less than (fewer), most, least Identify and represent numbers using objects and pictorial representations including the number line
