We will work on our character descriptions to find the baddie!

Read longer words using different strategies.

Answer questions and make inferences on the basis of what was said.

Explain what has happened in stories we have read.

Use correct names for each letter of the alphabet.

Read out my work loud enough for others to hear.

Make predictions based on what has been read.

Participate in discussions about different types of books.

Make links between books we have read.

Time

Tell and write the time to five minutes, including quarter past/to the hour and draw the hands on a clock face to show these times. Know the number of minutes in an hour and the number of hours in a day.

Position, direction and movement

Use mathematical vocabulary to describe position, direction and movement including movement in a straight line and distinguishing between rotation as a turn and in terms of right angles for quarter, half and three quarter turns (clockwise and anti-clockwise) order and arrange combinations of mathematical objects in patterns and sequences

Design and Technology

We will learn about Digital Writing and programming algorithms.

Geography/ History:

Is he/she friendly/ mean/ nice...?

At the end of the book:

Did you like this book? Why? What was your favourite part? Why?

What was the most interesting/ exciting part of the book?

Can you find it in the book?
